





A Palestinian Boyhood*

IU Kokomo will welcome former IU Kokomo Professor, Dr. Reja-e Busailah to discuss his new book.

“I am a poet and have written many poems about my childhood and about my country of origin, Palestine. My book draws on many of these poems. I have written it to express my feelings about the times when I lived among my people in a country we were expelled from by foreigners. Since our expulsion in 1948, I have lived in exile longing for the loss. Writing about this, is natural. There is much in the book about the culture of my people, their traditions, their customs, their way of life and so forth--all this I feel deserves to be preserved and presented to whoever is interested in studying it.”


